



APPLYING TO VETERINARY SCHOOL IN CANADA

You apply to the 4-year Veterinary Medicine degree **AFTER** completing **a *4-year Bachelor degree in Biology/Animal Science//Zoology/Biomedical Science**, etc.

Total 8 years of study: 4 years of Bachelor of Science + 4 years Doctor of Veterinary Medicine*

*You can apply after 2 years of undergraduate studies, but only 2% of applicants are accepted early.

ILAC will help you to enter your first bachelor degree at one of our excellent partner schools.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLYING TO VETERINARY SCHOOL

- *Five Canadian universities have the veterinary medicine program.
- *Three schools accept international students. The international seats usually go to US students.
- *There is high competition to be accepted. 300 spots in Canada.
- *For every student accepted, 700 1000 applicants are rejected.

You need excellent grades, and the universities also consider:

- 1. Your score on the GRE science and or MCAT (medical school admissions) exam.
- 2. Experience with Animals/Letters of references --2 letters must be from a veterinarian with whom you worked as a volunteer / assistant.
- 3. Extra-curricular activities. They want to know what you do outside of school.
